CLOS DU MURGER

**COLOR:** white wine

**GRAPE VARIETY:** Chardonnay

**SURFACE AREA:** 93 a

**HARVEST:** manual

**AGEING:** in barrels, some of which are new depending on the vintage

**ETYMOLOGY:** The word 'murger' underlines the presence of mainly flat, grey stones removed from the ground over the centuries by the winegrowers while working their vineyards. The word 'clos' emphasizes that the vine is surrounded by walls.



**VINEYARD CHARACTERISTICS:**

This southwest facing property lies on the hard limestone bedrock of the central Meursault knoll. The name 'Clos du Murger' is officially registered as a trademark. This enclosed area, totally surrounded by walls more than 2 meters high, has given its name to the village square that adjoins it.

**VINIFICATION AND AWARDS:**

The vineyard was planted in 2001. The Bourgogne Clos du Murger is totally vinified in barrels for 11 months: both alcoholic and malolactic fermentations, followed by ageing. Its location together with its remarkable track record of 8 medals at the Concours Général Agricole de Paris to date (3 Gold, 3 Silver and 2 Bronze) allow us to hope for its future classification as a Meursault village wine.

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
